<p>Early Morning Flight</p> <p>6:30am Drop Off @ Airport for Check-In Flight Departs / Arrives</p> <p>10:00-12:00pm Visit the Bishop Museum <i>Bishop Museum was founded in 1889 by Charles Reed Bishop in honor of his late wife, Princess Bernice Pauahi Bishop, the last descendant of the royal Kamehameha family. The Museum was established to house the extensive collection of Hawaiian artifacts and royal family heirlooms of the Princess, and has expanded to include millions of artifacts, documents and photographs about Hawai'i and other Pacific island cultures. Today, the museum is recognized throughout the world for its cultural collections, research projects, consulting services and public educational programs, housing one of the largest natural history specimen collections in the world. Serving and representing the interests of Native Hawaiians is a primary purpose of the Museum.</i></p> <p>12:00-1:00pm Lunch & Relax Lawn @ Bishop Museum</p> <p>1:30-2:30pm Tour `Iolani Palace <i>A Hawaiian national treasure and the only official state residence of royalty in the United States, `Iolani Palace was the official residence of the Hawaiian Kingdom's last two monarchs—King Kalakaua, who built the Palace in 1882, and his sister and successor, Queen Lili`uokalani. During the monarchy period, the Palace was the center of social and political activity in the Kingdom of Hawai'i. Though the grandeur of the Palace was neglected after the overthrow of the monarchy, restoration and preservation that began through the efforts of concerned individuals continues.
